Home learning for 13/04/2020 Mini beasts – Worms. (Text: Superworm)

<p><u>Shape & Space focus</u> This week we are focusing on pattern, positional language and length.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make simple patterns using colours, shapes, sizes etc. -Collect 5 pebbles and 5 leaves from outside. Make a pattern that goes, 'pebble, leaf, pebble, leaf'. Can you complete it? You could paint the pebbles different colours and make patterns with the colours. -Make your own repeating pattern worm using wool (see attached images) -Ask someone to clap a repeating pattern for you to copy. Repeat it back to them. Then, you clap a repeating pattern and see if they can repeat it. Try this with some other body percussion, including tapping on your legs, knees, shoulders and head. You could tap your hands, knees, head, hands, knees, head. -Choose 2 of your favourite-coloured pens. Draw a circle with one colour and a triangle with another, then another circle with the same first colour and another triangle with the same second colour. Continue the pattern. Can you make a pattern with the 2 the same, then another 2 the same, e.g. 'red, red, blue, blue'? -Use the Internet or books to look at patterns on animals. Look at tigers, zebras, snakes, giraffes and cheetahs. What other animals can you find with patterns? Can you draw any of the patterns? - https://www.topmarks.co.uk/ordering-and-sequencing/shape-patterns • Length. - Can you make your own worms out of socks/tights/card/paper/wool and order them from shortest to longest? Longest to shortest? Research some interesting facts about worms. Write a sentence about your favourite fact and illustrate it. Don't forget to use a finger space between each word. • Create your own 3 or 4 page book about Superworm, using positional language; behind, next to, in front of... (Sewing/treasury tags/selloptape/hope punch/string/split pin etc...) • If you have an Ipad, download the free beebot app & play. • Have fun practising your ball skills. Can you throw and catch a ball? Is it easier to catch a smaller ball or larger one?
