During the summer term our SEAL topic will be 'Relationships' and 'Changes'. We will continue to recognize the things that make each one of focus and us special on the Staveley values, which are Resilience, Compassion, Friendship and Respect.

Understanding of the World

The children will have the opportunity to explore and investigate minibeasts in the local environment. Create and develop their own Minibeasts and habitat – Matching labels Children to use various resources to research and record information for class display. The children will have access to Plasma Pete on a daily basis to play games, draw and watch films to enhance our learning.

Physical Development

We shall be strengthening our fine motor skills by using tools and equipment during our play, mark making and handwriting. In P.E., the children will explore different ways to travel with confidence on and off equipment. Experiment with different ways to use a variety of equipment and prepare for sports day. We will learn how to keep our bodies healthy both inside and out.

Literacy

During this topic, we will be reading and writing different types of fiction, nonfiction and poetry. Stories and information will be read at every opportunity to enhance our topic work. Many opportunities will be given to the children to mark-make and write both guided and independently. We shall be writing news, poems, rhymes and information about topic. We will be continuing to learn the letters and sounds we need to read and write.

Expressive Arts and Design

We will use a variety of media including paint, crayons, clay and junk modelling to develop our artistic skills. We will also be exploring printing, designing patterns – honeycomb (bees) and using multi-media collage to create 3d minibeasts. We shall sing songs and play a variety of instruments.

Children will be learning to use an iPad and programme a Beebot to follow directions.

Communication and Language

Children will listen and respond in a variety of situations. They will be listening to stories, poems; following lots of instructions and create mind maps about mini beasts and where they live.
