I have attached a variety of activities for you to try at home. These include...</p> <p>Make a union jack flag and/or bunting. You could design your own bunting using different 2D shapes?</p> <p>Make a paper spitfire glider.</p> <p>Make red, white and blue paper chains to decorate your house.</p> <p>Dress up for the occasion in red, white and blue!</p> <p>Have a celebration tea party! You could try some simple baking for this. Think afternoon tea! Sandwiches, scones, fairy cakes etc...</p> <p>Make a hat for the occasion, Even a simple decorated head band.</p>

(PDF sent)</p> <p><u>Go to Summer term – week 3 – lesson 1 – Part whole relationship number bonds</u></p> <p>This lesson may take a few days to cover properly. It focuses on number bonds to 20. Use this opportunity to practise bonds to 20. ~This can be linked to number bonds to 10.
