What changes have humans made to the local environment? Plants and animals are unable to make big changes to their environment, and therefore are very vulnerable to changes in their habitat. List the threats to local habitats that you see in the images on the slides, and add your own suggestions.</p> <p>Go on an outdoor visit to a suitable local habitat e.g. a local park, the river, the woods. It needs to be a place that will show signs of man-made changes. Survey the local habitat and make detailed observations. On the Local Habitat Survey Activity Sheet, draw a sketch map of the habitat, drawing and labelling any environmental dangers that you see there.</p> <p><i>Next week, we will use this information to think about how to make positive changes.</i></p>	<p>History: Ancient Greek Olympics</p> <p>The Battle of Marathon Look at the map and then read about the main differences between Sparta and Athens. Sort and stick statements into Athens or Sparta using Athens or Sparta Activity Sheet. Order the main events of the battle Would you rather have been an Athenian or a Spartan?</p> <p>Art: See Science work – sketching You could also use digital media to record images of the habitat you have been to e.g. photographs, videos.</p> <p>Music: Keep learning the songs and dances for the Virtual Big Sing</p>
